

WHY CHOOSE TAFE

With hands-on practical learning, high levels of student support and opportunities to work with our key industry partners, TAFE gives you the skills you need to achieve your future career goals.

Whether you have recently finished school or university, have decided to change careers or further develop your skills, TAFE can support you to achieve the skills that you require to gain employment.



FREE TAFE COURSES

Whether you're looking to commence your career, reskill or upskill, we offer a wide range of Free TAFE courses*, providing you study opportunities to fill identified in-demand industry jobs.

Free TAFE can help cover the cost of tuition for selected courses. See if you meet the eligibility criteria below.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Residential status: Any Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident or New Zealand citizen living in Victoria is eligible for a Free TAFE course.

Previous qualification: You can do your first Free TAFE course no matter what qualifications you already hold. This applies to all qualifications - whether they be through TAFE or university.

You will be charged for any additional non-tuition fees relating to your studies, which may include material and consumable fees.

FREE TAFE PRIORITY PATHWAYS

Free TAFE Priority Pathways are courses that progress within a study area, for example you can progress from a Certificate to a Diploma in the same study area. (e.g. from a Certificate IV in Accounting and Bookkeeping, to a Diploma of Accounting).

Free TAFE priority pathways are courses in priority areas that need skilled workers.

Free TAFE will cover your tuition fees for both courses. You'll need to finish one course before starting the next course.

Free TAFE priority pathways do not include apprenticeship pathway courses.

Some Priority Pathway courses are not offered at Kangan Institute. See the full list of priority pathways at vic.gov.au/free-tafe.

You can continue to study your Priority Pathway at Kangan Institute even if you have started the Pathway at another TAFE.

JOBTRAINER

If you have completed a Free TAFE course under the JobTrainer program, you can also do another Free TAFE course. The second course can be in a pathway or non-pathway program.

*Free TAFE on selected courses only. Eligibility criteria apply. Tuition is free. Other fees and charges, including materials and consumables may apply.

WHERE DO I START?

PREREQUISITES

You may need to meet some entry requirements in order to enrol in one of our programs. These requirements vary for each course, but may include:

- A minimum age (some courses require that you are over 18 so that you can legally work in the industry).
- Satisfactory language, literacy and numeracy skills.
- A Police Check or a Working with Children Check (if you are working in an industry that has contact with children or the public).
- Evidence of immunisations. Some courses such as health care may require additional immunisations.

These prerequisites are not designed to be a blocker to entry to the course, but to ensure that you are compliant and ready to be employed in the industry once you complete your training with us.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING (RPL) AND SKILLS RECOGNITION

If you have acquired relevant skills and knowledge in your workplace through previous training, or even via volunteer work, you may not need to complete further study to obtain a qualification.

INDIGENOUS ENGAGEMENT CENTRE

The Indigenous Engagement Centre (IEC) at Kangan Institute is an innovative environment that fosters and promotes Indigenous learning, while supporting Indigenous students undertaking study and training in a wide array of courses across the institute.

Honouring the traditional landowners of the area, the Gunung-Willam-Balluk and Wurundjeri peoples, the centre merges the cultural heritage and values of these landowners with contemporary Aboriginal culture and strong networks with key Aboriginal organisations to ensure that our students are supported through their time with us.

As one of the state's largest providers of training and education, Kangan Institute delivers a wide range of courses and programs. Our courses are designed in consultation with communities and employers which means that Aboriginal students gain skills and knowledge while improving their networks and employment options.

OUR STUDENTS

The IEC welcomes all Indigenous Australians. Our students come from many different backgrounds ranging from early school leavers to people over 50.

We support students engaged in a variety of courses across the institute and conduct a number of events through the year, celebrating Aboriginal culture and key milestones to which all the students are invited to along with their friends and family.

Most importantly, we have a dedicated Koorie Student Support Officer, Koorie Liaison Officer as well as a Koorie Counsellor Officer based at the IEC to assist students in accessing the full range of support services and assistance in dealing with government agencies and other relevant organisations.

INDIGENOUS CULTURAL AWARENESS TRAINING (ICAT)

We are committed to supporting organisations in gaining a greater understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander History and Culture. This program enables workforces to build successful working relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The ICAT program is designed to provide participants with a practical understanding required for successfully working with the Victorian Indigenous Community. It also builds awareness of Indigenous issues in every day situations and aims to eradicate apprehension or misconception about Indigenous people.

We focus on developing improvement of strategies targeted at Indigenous recruitment and employment with follow-up support and ongoing consultation.

ELIGIBILITY & FEES

How much you pay is determined by the course you enrol in, the scheduled hours you commit to undertake, your eligibility for a government subsidised place and any concession entitlements you might be eligible for.

GOVERNMENT SUBSIDIES

You may be eligible for government subsidised training if you meet the eligibility requirements.

ADDITIONAL FEES

In addition to the tuition fee you may be required to pay materials and consumables fees relating to your course.

FULL FEE

If you are not eligible for government subsidised training you will pay the full fee listed on the respective course page.

CONCESSION

You may be entitled to a concession on your tuition fees for training at a Certificate IV or below, if you are in a government subsidised place and you meet eligibility criteria. If your tuition fee concession application is successful, your concession fee will be charged at 20% of the government subsidised tuition rate for your course.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in a government subsidised place will receive a fee waiver for tuition fees under the current Skills First Program at all program levels (including diploma, advanced diploma, vocational graduate certificate and vocational graduate diploma programs). You will still have to pay the materials and consumables fee (if studying a government subsidised course) and other non-tuition fees (if applicable) at the time of enrolment.

PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

Getting started on your journey after finishing school can be tough. With so many choices, expenses and paths to follow it can be a challenge to work out what's right for you.

TAFE is the perfect transition between school and university.

Your ATAR score is no barrier to further study, you can gain a Kangan Institute qualification and still go to university too.

Kangan Institute has formalised pathways with reputable universities.

There are benefits to completing your studies at TAFE before you start university:

- Develop your knowledge with hands-on, industry specific learning.
- Work in your chosen field while studying.
- Start off in a supportive environment with small class sizes and one-on-one interaction with teachers.
- Gain credits towards the completion of your degree course which could reduce the duration.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

FLEXIBLE PAYMENT PLAN

Kangan Institute offers eligible students the option of paying their course fees over time by setting up either weekly or fortnightly instalment payments to cover their tuition, materials and consumables.

VET STUDENT LOANS

A student loan scheme is available for eligible students and is only applicable to Diploma and Advanced Diploma level courses to assist in the payment of tuition fees whilst studying at TAFE. These are called VET Student Loans and are capped according to the course you are studying. These loans are income contingent and interest free and are repaid via the Australian Taxation Office when your income reaches a certain threshold. For 2025-2026 income year, the threshold is \$67,000. The loan will continue to be a debt to the government until it is repaid.

APPRENTICESHIPS INCENTIVES PROGRAM

The Australian government has established the Australian Apprenticeships Incentives Program to encourage genuine opportunities for people to enter into skills based training through Australian Apprenticeships.

Apprentices may be eligible for a range of payments to assist them with the initial set up costs and completion of their apprenticeship.

WHAT ARE APPRENTICESHIPS AND TRAINEESHIPS?

If you are interested in working in a skilled trade such as building, hairdressing, automotive or electrical then an apprenticeship is for you. If you are interested in working in a vocational role such as office administration or information technology then a traineeship will get you started. All our apprenticeship and traineeship programs incorporate learning that takes place in the workplace to help you to graduate with confidence, experience and ready for the workforce with real skills.

APPRENTICESHIP SUPPORT PROGRAM

Apprenticeship Support Officers (ASOs) are located across Victoria and offer a free and confidential support and advice service to registered apprentices and employers. They're part of a Victorian Government initiative to keep more apprentices in jobs and help more people complete their training.

PREPARATION AND RESEARCH

SIGN UP

Once you've found an employer, you both must contact an Apprentice Connect Australia Provider (ACAP). Select Kangan Institute as your preferred training provider to get started. If you are eligible for a Health Care Card, make sure you apply for one prior to enrolling so you are eligible for concession fees.


